Free Lead Remediation for Homeowners



Lead is a highly toxic metal that can cause a range of health problems, especially in young children. Prior to 1978, many homes were painted with lead-based paint. Although lead-based paint has been banned since 1978, old paint that is peeling or chipping, as well as dust from lead-based paint, can still pose serious health risks. Fortunately, the risks of lead poisoning due to deteriorating

house paint can be decreased considerably.

Salt Lake County's Lead Safe Salt Lake program offers free lead testing and remediation for homeowners and renters with children less than six years old or pregnant women who live in or frequently visit a home or apartment built before 1978. Free repairs may include new paint on the interior and exterior of homes, and the replacement of older windows. The program is available for households with moderate or low incomes. As an example, a family of three making less than \$49,500 annually would qualify.
