Holiday Garbage Collection Reminder



Your West Valley City Sanitation Team would like to remind you that summer holidays will not affect garbage collection. Please place your garbage and recycling containers on the curb on your regular pickup day, even if it falls on a holiday.

The only holidays affected are Thanksgiving, Christmas and New Year's Day, when garbage is collected one day



The end of the school year means the start of summer. This also means temperatures are up and kids are out playing more and more. Here are some simple safety tips to keep your family safe.

Never leave infants, children, or pets in a parked car, even if the windows are cracked open.



- Supervise young children at all times around fall hazards, such as stairs and playground equipment.
- Always supervise children when in or around water. Practice "touch supervision" (a term used by the American Academy of Pediatrics). This means that at all times, the supervising adult is within an arm's length of the child being watched, when near or in the water.
- Apply sunscreen with an SPF of at least 15 at least 30 mins before going outside.
- Drink lots of water
- Remember to always wear a helmet while riding bikes or scooters.
- Always check behind your car for little kids before backing
