A Message from Council Member Mike Winder

As taxpayers, we often grow cynical when we hear of federal funding for the \$223 million “Bridge to Nowhere” that goes from Ketchikan, Alaska to a tiny island of ten families; or the \$50 million dollar appropriation to study methane output from cows in Iowa. Perhaps this is why we are especially pleased when we hear of government actually taking business-savvy actions with our hard-earned money.

One such example is the phenomenally successful program of redevelopment, economic development, and community development areas (RDAs, EDAs, and CDAs). We currently have 14 of these unique areas in West Valley City, and their purposes range from cleaning up salvage yards to revitalizing 3500 South. One example of how they work is the North Central Economic Development Area.

Established early this year, the North Central Economic Development Area is a XXX acre area located on the southwest corner of Bangert Highway and SR-201. Already, this area has attracted a major commercial development – 201 Commerce Center, the largest development of its kind in the western United States.

Expected to be completed within ten years, 201 Commerce Center is a massive 115-acre development incorporating warehouse, industrial, and manufacturing uses. The 300 million dollar project will add approximately 1.8 million square feet of commercial space to West Valley City, bringing hundreds of thousands of dollars worth of tax revenue and providing thousands of jobs to residents of the City.

Located in Centennial Park and opened in 1999, the 96,000 square-foot Family Fitness Center is one of the Salt Lake valley's premier fitness facilities. With a variety of equipment, features, activities, and classes, the Family Fitness Center is a state-of-the-art fitness and recreation facility. The Family Fitness Center offers a lap pool, a leisure pool with the state's tallest indoor waterslide, basketball and racquetball courts, an indoor track, cardio equipment, a weight room, a climbing wall, dance and aerobic rooms, and a soft-play "edutainment" room for children.

Outdoor recreation is also available throughout West Valley City at 16 parks and two golf courses. StoneBridge Golf Club, purchased by West Valley City in 2002, is a championship 27-hole corporate golf experience designed by golf pro Johnny Miller. Located in the Lake Park Corporate Centre, this Scottish-links-style course perfectly complements the West Ridge Golf Course, an 18-hole public golf facility. In addition to golf, both facilities also offer pro shops and banquet facilities.

Recreation programs are also available for senior citizens at the Harman Senior Recreation Center. Recently renovated and expanded, the Harman Senior Recreation Center offers a variety of activities, including painting, crafts, exercise, movies, and field trips.


Utah Cultural Celebration Center News

The Wild Life of Dollores Shelledy

This summer, the Utah Cultural Celebration Center has partnered with wildlife sculptor and Utah resident Dollores Shelledy to host an outdoor exhibit entitled The Wild Life of Dollores Shelledy. Featuring approximately eight life-size wildlife sculptures, many of which have been shown throughout the western United States, this project is an exciting and unique partnership.

This outdoor show complements the experience of patrons attending both the WorldStage! concert series and the Face of Utah Sculpture IV exhibition, both happening now at the Utah Cultural Celebration Center. These life-size sculptures greet patrons and line walkways of the plaza and grounds, engaging visitors by offering a visual arts experience along with performing arts



The story behind Dollores Shelledy's work is extraordinary, and one to be shared with the public. A self-taught sculptor, Mrs. Shelledy began her work at age 60. Now 81, she is still active in the arts community, creating new sculptures every year, and even teaching in public schools to pass along her art to children. Many of her works can be seen throughout the Valley, including many entrance pieces to Hogle Zoo.
