A Cold Car is a Safe Car

As the colder weather approaches many people may be tempted to leave their vehicle warming up in their driveway in order to warm the interior of their car and to help in removing snow and ice from the windows. Unfortunately, the West Valley City Police Department receives many calls every year from citizens whose vehicles were stolen under just these circumstances. In 2007, seventy-three vehicles were stolen while they were left running in front of a home or in a driveway. In the early months of this year we have already had 42 vehicles stolen because they were left running while unattended. Also, be aware that some insurance companies will not cover the loss of your stolen car if the car was left running unattended when it was stolen. So please, when you are tempted to start your vehicle and leave it to warm up while you finish getting ready for work or school, remember how inconvenient it will be when you step outside and your car is missing. The West Valley City Police Department appreciates your help in keeping you and your property safe throughout the year.

Fall Leaf Cleanup

The weather has changed and so has the color of the trees, which means leaves are falling all over the City. The best way for residents to dispose of their leaves is to use the City's Bulky Waste service. The leaves must be bagged in order for crews to pick them up. The bags can ONLY contain leaves and no other waste, even green waste.

Do not pile leaves in the gutter for the street sweeper to pick them up, it is not possible for the sweeper to pick up all of the leaves. For a map on when Bulky Waste is picked up in your area, please visit www.wvc-ut.gov/bulkywaste.

On rainy days, City crews try hard to get through the City to clear storm drains of leaves and other debris. However, the City would appreciate citizens to take pride in their community and help the City crews out by cleaning storm drain grates to help prevent water backups.

Another alternative to get rid of your bagged leaves is to take them to a Salt Lake County regional park where a dumpster has been provided for bagged leaves. The closest locations to West Valley City are:

Southridge Park 5210 S. 4015 W.


Valley Regional Park 5100 S. 2700 W.

Remember, all leaves need to be bagged and all bags need to be tied. No other waste may be placed in the bags other than leaves or the bags will not be picked up during Bulky Waste or allowed in the dumpsters at the regional parks.

Local Artists Benefit from Utah Cultural Celebration Center's Partners Partners Program

The Utah Cultural Celebration Center recently announced it would continue its popular Partners Program, designed to assist local artists and arts organizations by providing them with something they need most – space. Now in its third year, the Partners Program has provided that coveted space for meetings, rehearsals, classes, and other weekly gatherings for Utah's music, art, singing and dance communities.

In essence, the *Partners Program* works like this: instead of paying the usual rental fees for using the Utah Cultural Celebration Center, artists and arts organizations admitted into the *Partners Program* are instead required three things in the goodwill exchange: 1) placement of the Cultural Center logo on all promotions and advertising; 2) mention of the Cultural Center as a partner in all public events, and 3) an agreed upon service from the partner organization equal to what facility costs would have been under a normal rental agreement. All kinds of exchanges are possible with preference to exchanges that offer public programs or performances.

Last year's success has not gone unnoticed by Cultural Center staff. "This is a real win-win situation," says Michael Christensen, UCCC Folklorist. "With the Partners Program, the Cultural Center fulfills its mission by truly assisting artists in an area they desperately need, and at the same time the Cultural Center gets something we value in return – performers, artists, demonstrators, and other partners that help the Cultural Center present quality community arts programs. Partners Program groups last year included Chinese Folk Orchestra & Choir; Los Vientos del Sur, New-Zealand American Association; Latin Dance Heritage and others. Without their participation, our arts and cultural programs would not have been as rich or diversified. It's truly a unique partnership."

And this year the Utah Cultural Celebration Center hopes to get even more organizations to apply for the program. "We are increasing our outreach efforts this year and hope to receive applications from many new groups. We have also expanded the number of hours the program will be offered, so we hope to serve more groups, while at the same time expand and diversify our public programs." explains Program Director Susan Klinker.

Transformation West: Changing the Face of West Valley City

West Valley City is changing daily. With construction and redevelopment projects happening throughout the City, it's hard to keep track of everything going on. Stay informed of the progress on some of the major developments, including 3500 South, City Center, Valley Fair Mall, and TRAX, by reading the *UpDate Newsletter* and watching for the Transformation West image.

One of the most exciting projects currently underway in West Valley City is the City Center project, which includes property from approximately I-215 to 3200 West, between 3500 South and 3650 South. The City Center project, when complete, will include a completely revitalized Valley Fair Mall, a TRAX light rail line, an Intermodal hub, connecting light rail, bus, and bus rapid transit, and mixed use development consisting of retail, residential, and office space.

Land acquisition for the City Center project has been underway for several months now and continues in earnest. Developer recruitment also shows great progress as several master developers have made extensive presentations and proposals to City and Redevelopment officials; these proposals are seriously being considered at this time. Along with these efforts, the Intermodal Hub and Plaza construction also moves rapidly forward with the demolition of several homes and businesses just west of City Hall.

In addition to the progress being made west of 2700 West, there is major construction underway at Valley Fair Mall. After a groundbreaking early this year, the \$60 million Valley Fair Mall renovation project's first phase got underway. Construction on the mall continues at a rapid pace, with several buildings nearing completion. This new development is expected to bring in several major tenants, including Olive Garden, Best Buy, and PETCO.

In addition to the City Center project and Valley Fair Mall construction, major changes are being made to West Valley City's transportation infrastructure. Construction continues on the West Valley TRAX line, which will bring light rail transit right to the heart of West Valley City, joining Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) and regular bus transit at the new Intermodal Hub, near West Valley City Hall. Construction on the hub is starting to pick up, and Market Street has been closed from Lehman Avenue heading south to 3650 South to allow crews to work more easily. Be-

sides the closure, construction should not impede motorists visiting America First Credit Union or City Hall. For more information on the UTA TRAX project, visit www.rideuta.com/projects/westvalleylightrail.

Construction has begun on 3500 South to widen the road to add more travel lanes. Additionally, the project will include the installation of a dedicated lane for Bus Rapid Transit (BRT) as well as burial of power and fiber optic communication lines. New curb, gutter, and sidewalk will also be installed, and UDOT will partner with the City to install trees and lighting.

UDOT and Granite Construction are still finalizing details with regard to schedule, approach and phasing of construction activities. The information below provides a general outline of construction activities, with expected milestones and impacts.

November 2008 - spring 2009

- Construction begins in early November.
- Utility relocations will be completed on the roadway's outer edges.
- Traffic will be routed to the middle of the roadway.

Spring 2009 - fall 2009

- South half of the roadway will be reconstructed.
- Traffic will be moved to the north side of the roadway.

Fall 2009 - summer 2010

- North half of the roadway will be reconstructed.
- Traffic will be moved to the south side of the roadway.
- Project completion is planned for summer 2010.

West Valley City is excited to move forward with these projects that are truly transforming the city.
