1. **APPROVAL OF MINUTES OF STUDY MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 10, 2015**
The Council read and considered Minutes of the Study Meeting held November 10, 2015. There were no changes, corrections or deletions.

Councilmember Vincent moved to approve the Minutes of the Study Meeting held November 10, 2015. Councilmember Nordfelt seconded the motion.

A voice vote was taken and all members voted in favor of the motion.

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Councilmember Lang and Councilmember Huynh arrived at the meeting at 4:34 P.M.

2. **PRESENTATION BY UDOT REGARDING RECONSTRUCTION ALONG I-215 FROM 300 EAST TO S.R. 201**

Upon recognition, Oanh Le-Spradlin, Project Manager for UDOT (Utah Department of Transportation) discussed future UDOT road improvements to I-215, including a timeline for proposed portions of the project and what to expect, summarized as follows:

- WB I-215; 300 East to Redwood Road:
 - Removing 8.5' of existing pavement and replacing with new asphalt
- I-215; 4700 South to S.R. 201
 - Replacing existing pavement with new concrete
 - Adding new auxiliary lanes
 - Completing minor interchange modifications
 - Reconstructing bridge over S. R. 201
- I-215; 4700 South to S. R. 201 – Intersection at I-215 and S. R. 201
- I-215; 4700 South to S. R. 201 – Intersection at I-215 and 3500 South
- I-215; 4700 South to S. R. 201 – Intersection at I-215 and 4700 South
- Schedule: Spring 2016 through late 2017
- What to Expect:
 - Westbound I-215 from Redwood Road to 300 East
 - Night and weekend work
 - Lane closures and width restrictions
 - Approximately two to three months
 - I-215 from 4700 South to S. R. 201
 - Long-term lane closures and width restrictions
 - Intermittent ramp closures
 - Short-term closure of S. R. 201 Interchange while the newly built bridge is moved
 - Approximately 20 months
- Stakeholder Efforts
 - One-on-one business meetings
 - Mailers
 - City presentation/meetings
 - City newsletters/utility bills
 - Weekly email updates

During the above presentation of information, members of the City Council discussed proposed changes and asked questions regarding the improvements.

3. **REVIEW AGENDA FOR REGULAR MEETING SCHEDULED NOVEMBER 24, 2015**

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The City Council reviewed and discussed the following item on the Agenda for the Regular Council Meeting scheduled later this night:

Item No. 8. A. – ORDINANCE NO. 15-37, ENACT A TEMPORARY LAND USE REGULATION APPLICABLE TO ALL LAND USE APPLICATIONS FOR PROPERTY LOCATED BETWEEN 5600 WEST AND 5800 WEST AND FROM 2200 SOUTH TO 2400 SOUTH

City Manager, Wayne Pyle, discussed proposed Ordinance No. 15-37 that would enact a temporary land use regulation applicable to all land use applications from property located between 5600 West and 5800 West and from 2200 South to 2400 South.

Mr. Pyle advised that regarding the proposed moratorium the Council, at its discretion, could modify the included properties by referencing the extended map when deliberating in the Regular Meeting scheduled later this night.

4. AWARDS, CEREMONIES AND PROCLAMATIONS SCHEDULED DECEMBER 1, 2015

A. EMPLOYEE OF THE MONTH AWARD, DECEMBER 2015 – AARON CRIM, PUBLIC RELATIONS, ADMINISTRATION

Upon inquiry, Councilmember Buhler indicated he would read the nomination of Aaron Crim, Public Relations/Administration, to receive the Employee of the Month Award for December 2015, at the Regular Council Meeting scheduled December 1, 2015, at 6:30 P.M. Mr. Crim had been nominated for his abilities in creating effective imagery that complemented and helped relay communications by and for the Police Department and Animal Shelter.

B. PRESENTATION OF ENGLISH LANGUAGE AWARDS TO STUDENTS FROM ENGLISH SKILLS LEARNING CENTER AND GRANITE PEAKS LEARNING CENTER

Mayor Bigelow stated a presentation of the English Language Awards to students from the English Skills Learning Center and Granite Peaks Learning Center had been scheduled for the Regular Council Meeting on December 1, 2015, at 6:30 P.M.

5. PUBLIC HEARINGS SCHEDULED DECEMBER 1, 2015

A. PUBLIC HEARING, APPLICATION NO. GP-1-2015 FILED BY WEST VALLEY CITY, UPDATE OF THE WEST VALLEY CITY GENERAL PLAN

Mayor Bigelow informed a public hearing had been advertised for the Regular Council Meeting scheduled December 1, 2015, in order for the City Council to hear and consider public comments regarding update of the West Valley City General Plan.

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Proposed Ordinance No. 15-38 related to the proposal to be considered by the City Council subsequent to the public hearing, was discussed as follows:

ORDINANCE NO. 15-38, ADOPTING AN UPDATE TO THE WEST VALLEY CITY GENERAL PLAN

City Manager, Wayne Pyle, discussed proposed Ordinance No. 15-38 that would adopt an update to the West Valley City General Plan. Written information previously provided to the City Council included the following:

Since the last update in 2009 a number of significant changes had occurred in the City prompting the Council to direct staff to update the General Plan. Some of the changes included:

- The City's population has grown by approximately 10,000
- About 1,750 new housing units have been constructed
- UDOT constructed the Mountain View Corridor between 6200 S and 5400 S and acquired most of the right-of-way needed to extend the facility to SR-201
- The West Valley light rail line was completed in 2011
- Significant local roads were constructed including 2400 W, the extension of 6400 West and Cultural Center Drive
- Major developments have been or are being built including the ARA Industrial Center, 201 Commerce, Highbury Centre, Valley Fair Mall renovation and Fairbourne Station

The General Plan was a comprehensive and advisory document that provided a broad overview of the City's path into the future regarding housing, employment, recreation, transportation, and land use decisions. The Plan in and of itself did not provide specific regulations, directives, or incentives. The City used many other tools such as zoning amendments, Council resolutions, and capital improvement projects to apply the principles contained in the General Plan.

A timeline had been provided that outlined the process leading up to the creation of the proposed General Plan. Staff hosted seven well-attended meetings where residents and business owners were invited to provide feedback on each of the seven opportunity areas. In addition to those meetings for the public, City staff met with the City Council over 20 times since the beginning of the process at the end of 2013 to discuss a variety of General Plan topics including: lot size and housing standards, 4100 South, Redwood Road, existing neighborhoods, chapter and map draft reviews and the Moderate Income Housing Plan.

City Manager, Wayne Pyle, stated the General Plan had been looked at in various stages over the past two years. He indicated the City Council could choose to

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move ahead with the update at this point or take time to review the document in its entirety to be considered at a future date.

Upon discussion, Councilmember Lang requested a copy of the current and proposed map.

Mayor Bigelow also requested a comparison of the document and some of the changes that occurred as well.

Councilmember Rushton indicated the General Plan was meant to be a guiding document that changed and it might not necessarily be beneficial to compare current language with proposed changes.

After further discussion, the Council concurred that taking a few weeks to read through the General Plan update would be beneficial.

The City Council will hold a public hearing and consider Application No. GP-1-2015 and proposed Ordinance No. 15-38 at the Regular Council Meeting scheduled December 1, 2015, at 6:30 P.M.

6. ORDINANCE NO. 15-39, AMENDING CHAPTER 3-10 OF THE WEST VALLEY CITY MUNICIPAL CODE TO AMEND PROVISIONS GOVERNING ADMINISTRATIVE ADVISORY ORGANIZATIONS

Paul Isaac, Assistant City Manager/HR Director, discussed proposed Ordinance No. 15-39 that would amend Chapter 3-10 of the West Valley City Municipal Code to amend provisions governing administrative advisory organizations.

Written information had previously been provided to the City Council as follows:

The proposed ordinance would make a variety of changes to the provisions of Chapter 3-10 including changes to eligibility requirements for membership on City boards. Chapter 3-10 of the Municipal Code governed creation and operation of administrative advisory organizations. The administrative advisory organizations were intended to offer residents an opportunity to serve their community and offer valuable insight to City officials and City staff concerning desires and needs of residents. Changes would be as follows:

1. The ordinance would eliminate caps on the number of members who could serve on the Parks and Recreation Advisory Committee, the Clean and Beautiful Committee, the Arts Council, the Historical Society, the Sister City Committee, and the UCCC Advisory Board.
2. The ordinance would require members of the aforementioned boards be West Valley City citizens.

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3. The ordinance would lower quorum requirements so that boards could move forward with business when faced with attendance difficulties.
4. The ordinance would eliminate the Cultural Arts Board.
5. The ordinance clarified procedures for dissolving a board and allowing continued service on the board after a change in eligibility requirements.

The Assistant City Manager and the Council further discussed the proposed ordinance changes including the option of allowing boards to function as a community council.

Councilmember Buhler stated many of the existing volunteers had served for long periods of time and inquired if those individuals would be grandfathered in to continue to provide a wealth of knowledge. Mr. Isaac agreed this would be a good idea moving forward.

Councilmember Rushton indicated if the City was in charge of the committee he would prefer City employees and residents be involved. He stated however if the boards operated as more of a community council with the City not being involved, he would not care who served.

The Council further discussed the benefits and drawbacks of having residents and non-residents serve on various committees. They also discussed committees running independently, the City's involvement, and how this could potentially work.

Councilmember Lang stated the boards should be residents only and if there were not enough people interested the board could be dissolved and an employee could step in and take over responsibilities.

The City Council will consider proposed Ordinance No. 15-39 at the Regular Council Meeting scheduled December 1, 2015, at 6:30 P.M.

7. **RESOLUTION NO. 15-189, DISSOLVING THE WEST VALLEY CITY CULTURAL ARTS BOARD**

Paul Isaac, Assistant City Manager/HR Director, discussed proposed Resolution No. 15-189 that would dissolve the West Valley City Cultural Arts Board.

Mr. Isaac stated if the CAB (Cultural Arts Board) was eliminated the City would need to find a way to fill that void.

The Council discussed ZAP funds and different ways of potentially helping an independent CAB financially.

Mr. Isaac advised the City could donate or contribute to a community council until it was able to fund itself.

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Upon further discussion, Councilmember Huynh stated he would support the idea of a community council.

Councilmember Rushton indicated that based on discussions by the City Council, it would be more of an independent arts committee as opposed to a community council.

The City Council concurred that more information regarding the options discussed during the meeting would need to be provided before the Council could move forward.

8. **RESOLUTION NO. 15-190, APPROVING THE REDWOOD ROAD TRANSPORTATION STUDY INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT BETWEEN WEST VALLEY CITY AND UTAH TRANSIT AUTHORITY, SALT LAKE CITY, THE CITY OF WEST JORDAN, CITY OF TAYLORSVILLE, SANDY CITY, SOUTH JORDAN CITY, SALT LAKE COUNTY, UTAH DEPARTMENT OF TRANSPORTATION, AND WASATCH FRONT REGIONAL COUNCIL.**

Steve Pastorik, CED Department, discussed proposed Resolution No. 15-190 that would approve the Redwood Road Transportation Study Interlocal Agreement between West Valley City and Utah Transit Authority, Salt Lake City, the City of West Jordan, City of Taylorsville, Sandy City, South Jordan City, Salt Lake County, Utah Department of Transportation, and Wasatch Front Regional Council.

Written information previously provided to the City Council included the following:

The proposed interlocal agreement would fund a transportation study to analyze and identify the transportation needs of Redwood Road through the year 2040 from a corridor-wide perspective. Specifically, the study would:

- Describe existing traffic, ridership, and physical constraints and then perform a baseline projection of how the corridor would evolve over time
- Engage cities, businesses, and the public through interviews, focus groups, and surveys to gather stakeholder input
- Produce a long list of various transit and roadway investment alternatives based upon stakeholder desires, traffic modeling, and opportunities for connectivity
- Narrow the long list to produce a short list of alternatives based on established screening criteria

The outcome of the study would be the identification of a preferred transportation alternative for Redwood Road that included transit, roadway and active transportation investments from the short list based upon cost, funding competitiveness and travel demand analysis. The study would also identify next steps for implementation of the Preferred Transportation Alternative including phasing and project development.

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Mr. Pastorik advised the proposal would look at transportation needs from the northern boundary of Salt Lake City to 11400 South by the year 2040. He also advised this could include specific improvements such as BRT, and others. He added land use recommendations had also been discussed in early conversations but the cities involved asked that not be included in the study. He stated the study would focus solely on transportation.

Mayor Bigelow stated a lot of money was being provided by the Utah Transit Authority (UTA) that likely meant transportation improvements would include mass transit.

Upon inquiry by Councilmember Lang regarding if City staff would be involved, Mr. Pastorik advised that he and Nicole Cottle, Assistant City Manager/CED Director, would participate.

Upon further inquiry by Councilmember Buhler regarding the necessity of a study, Mr. Pastorik advised that transit would be evaluated with what made the most sense, how to implement improvements, intersection improvements and potential changes.

Councilmember Vincent pointed out Redwood Road varied in different cities and uniformity should try to be gained.

City Manager, Wayne Pyle, clarified that it was difficult to have uniformity on Redwood Road since traffic counts were significantly different in various areas.

Mayor Bigelow indicated he was fine with mass transit but did not want to see dividers in the road that would affect businesses.

Councilmember Vincent indicated a lot of high density uses existed along Redwood Road and the transportation study was needed.

The City Council will consider proposed Resolution No. 15-190 at the Regular Council Meeting scheduled December 1, 2015, at 6:30 P.M.

9. **RESOLUTION NO. 15-191, APPROVING AN INTERLOCAL COOPERATION AGREEMENT BETWEEN WEST VALLEY CITY AND THE ATTORNEY GENERAL'S OFFICE, BLUFFDALE CITY (SARATOGA SPRINGS POLICE DEPARTMENT), COTTONWOOD HEIGHTS, DRAPER CITY, GRANITE SCHOOL DISTRICT, MURRAY CITY, SALT LAKE AIRPORT POLICE, SALT LAKE COUNTY, SALT LAKE CITY, SANDY CITY, SOUTH JORDAN CITY, SOUTH SALT LAKE CITY, TOOELE CITY, TOWN OF ALTA, UTAH STATE DEPARTMENT OF CORRECTIONS, UTAH STATE DEPARTMENT OF NATURAL RESOURCES, UNIFIED POLICE DEPARTMENT, UNIVERSITY OF UTAH POLICE, UTAH TRANSIT AUTHORITY (UTA), UTAH STATE**

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DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC SAFETY, UTAH MOTOR VEHICLE ENFORCEMENT DIVISION AND WEST JORDAN CITY (THE AGENCIES) FOR MULTI JURISDICTIONAL SHERIFF AND POLICE SERVICES

Anita Schwemmer, Acting Police Chief, discussed proposed Resolution No. 15-191 that would approve an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement between West Valley City and the Attorney General's Office, Bluffdale City (Saratoga Springs Police Department), Cottonwood Heights, Draper City, Granite School District, Murray City, Salt Lake Airport Police, Salt Lake County, Salt Lake City, Sandy City, South Jordan City, South Salt Lake City, Tooele City, Town of Alta, Utah State Department Of Corrections, Utah State Department of Natural Resources, Unified Police Department, University of Utah Police, Utah Transit Authority (UTA), Utah State Department of Public Safety, Utah Motor Vehicle Enforcement Division and West Jordan City (the Agencies) for multi jurisdictional sheriff and police services.

Written information previously provided to the City Council included the following:

The Council recently passed a resolution authorizing the execution of an interlocal agreement for mutual aid in law enforcement matters between West Valley City and other cities in and around the Wasatch. After approval, several substantial changes had been made to the agreement and the Police Department sought approval by the Council of the amended agreement.

The changes included wording that brought the agreement more closely in line with the Utah State statute regarding an outside agency's authorization to act in another jurisdiction and clarified that agencies were liable for the actions of their employees, regardless of where those actions took place.

Law enforcement agencies had varying resources of equipment and personnel. It benefitted all cities and their citizens when law enforcement agencies worked together, pooled resources to prevent and detect crime, and responded to major incidents such as riots and mass shootings. Under previous interlocal agreements the West Valley City Police Department had rendered aid to and received aid from numerous agencies throughout the Wasatch.

Acting Police Chief Schwemmer reviewed the significant changes in detail as proposed.

A. RESOLUTION NO. 15-192, RATIFY THE CITY MANAGER'S APPOINTMENT OF DON CHRISTENSEN TO THE WEST VALLEY CITY HOUSING AUTHORITY COMMISSION FOR A TERM

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COMMENCING JANUARY 5, 2016 AND ENDING DECEMBER 31, 2020

Mayor Bigelow discussed proposed Resolution No. 15-192 that would ratify the City Manager's appointment of Don Christensen to the West Valley City Housing Authority Commission for a term commencing January 5, 2016 and ending December 31, 2020.

Upon inquiry regarding various appointments, City Recorder, Nichole Camac, advised that the Housing Authority terms were five years so those would not need to be renewed until 2016. She further clarified that new members of the City Council were automatically placed on the boards of the Redevelopment Agency and Housing Authority and those ran with the term of Council office.

B. RESOLUTION NO. 15-193, RATIFY THE CITY MANAGER'S APPOINTMENT OF DEANN VARNEY AS SECRETARY OF THE LICENSE HEARING BOARD

City Manager, Wayne Pyle, discussed proposed Resolution No. 15-193 that would ratify his appointment of DeAnn Varney as secretary of the License Hearing Board.

Mr. Pyle advised this position had previously been held by Carel Hicks who had recently retired, and the position now needed to be filled by a new Deputy City Recorder.

The City Council will consider proposed Resolution Nos. 15-192 and 15-193 as listed on the Consent Agenda at the Regular Council Meeting scheduled December 1, 2015, at 6:30 P.M.
