West Valley City To Recognize Domestic Violence Awareness Month

In 2006, there were 28 domestic violence homicides in Utah and nationally more than three women are murdered every day by their intimate partners. Domestic violence occurs in all socioeconomic, religious and ethnic groups and has devastating effects on communities and families. While these statistics are staggering, domestic violence is a social issue – one that is preventable when communities work together and take a stand against violence!

Domestic Violence Awareness Month evolved from the first Day of Unity observed in October, 1981 by the National Coalition Against Domestic Violence. The intent was to connect battered women's advocates across the nation who were working to end violence against women and their children. The Day of Unity soon became a special week when a range of activities were conducted at the local, state, and national levels.

These activities were as varied and diverse as the program sponsors but had common themes: mourning those who have died because of domestic violence, celebrating those who have survived, and connecting those who work to end violence.

West Valley City will be observing Domestic Violence Awareness Month with a series of displays and events. On October 15, a Silent Witness display will be installed at City Hall, providing a haunting visual of the effects of domestic violence. On October 16, a candlelight walk will be held, honoring the victims of domestic violence.

Redwood Road: 2320 S- 3500 S.

- Crews will continue working on driveways, sidewalks, curb radii and landscaping on the West side throughout September.

3500 S. & Bangerter Hwy. CFI

The CFI at 3500 South and Bangerter Highway opened on September 17. Learn how to navigate the CFI by watching a new 3D simulation on the project Web site at www.udot.utah.gov. Instruction cards and/or brief presentations are also available upon request.

I-215 WEST, 3800 SOUTH TO 4100 SOUTH BRIDGES

Nightwork is anticipated through mid September as the project nears completion. I-215 West will be restricted to one lane from 9:00pm to 5:00am during these periods. Potential late night hard closure of northbound I-215

West may also occur. Please expect congestion in the area and seek alternate routes whenever possible.

I-215 West will be reopened to four lanes in each direction following these final activities. Crews began work on the 4100 South structure over I-215 West on September 10. 4100 South will be restricted to one lane in each direction as crews conduct bridge rehabilitation activities. These restrictions will remain in place through October.

3500 South: Decker Lake Drive to Bangerter Highway

Phase 1 of the 3500 South project, from Decker Lake Drive to 2700 West, remains on hold pending funding prioritization. The UDOT Design Team continues to move forward on final design of Phase 2, from 2700 West to Bangerter Highway. Right-of-way acquisition has also begun within Phase 2. As final design progresses, necessary right-of-way contacting will continue.
